**General**



Just as a reminder, the office and subsequent departments will be closed beginning at noon on Thursday, September 19, 2019 for the day so employees can attend and participate in an active shooter training. The training consists of 2 hours classroom and 2 hours active participation. State Troopers George Walker and Jeremy Pyburn are certified instructors of ALICE. We are fortunate to have both Trooper Pyburn and Walker conduct this training at no cost to the Town of Bridgton. This training which is known as ALICE (Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter and Evacuate) goes beyond the conventional lockdown. The training is so universal that its resources can be used not only in our office setting but anywhere. The actions taken by civilians, in between when an event begins and law enforcement arrives are significant and can increase survivability.

On Tuesday, September 17, 2019 from 4:30p.m. to 6:30p.m. there will be a Planning Board workshop specifically on medical marijuana proposed rules and regulations. This is the second workshop subsequent to the one held on Friday, August 16th which was held at the Town Hall. On September 4<sup>th</sup> Brenda Day, Administrative Assistant, sent an email as an invite to the Board of Selectmen for their participation.
