Activities

The police department totaled 412 calls for service in September, with 22 motor vehicle accidents, 5 disturbance calls, 4 domestic violence, 51 citizen assists, 23 alarms, 8 harassment complaints, 6 citizen disputes, 14 arrests, 3 noise complaints, 70 traffic violations, 1 traffic hazards, 4 reports of thefts, 2 disabled motor vehicles, 2 mental health events, 3 criminal trespass, 1 criminal mischief, 40 911 hang-ups, 1 suicide attempts, 3 juvenile problems, 8 animal problems, 25 checks for suspicious activity, 27 agency assists, 17 attempt to locate, and 4 reports of fraud.
