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The monthly report for the month of January 2022, from the Bridgton Fire Department.

**Personnel:** The department has begun our annual required training to meet the Bureau of Labor Standards requirements. Approximately half the department has completed the training. The other half will either attend a makeup session or do the training online.

I also want to give a shout out to BFD member and fulltime dispatcher at CCRCC, Jack Bueller, on his recent award, Employee of the Quarter for October-December 2021. Well deserved award on many fronts. Congratulations Jack!

**Apparatus:** After rejecting 1 bid for \$800.00 in December for Engine 2 we readvertised the bid and put a minimum of \$2500.00 on it. We did receive 1 bid prior to the deadline of January 6<sup>th</sup> in the amount of \$5500.00 from S.A. McLean, Limerick ME. After consultation with the manager we decided to take the bid and the truck was paid for and picked up on January 10<sup>th</sup>.

**Equipment:** The departments SCBA airpicks were flow tested on January 24<sup>th</sup> to comply with state mandates and ensure each pack is functioning properly. 2 packs did need minor repairs but all in all our folks are taking good care of these critical and expensive pieces of equipment. The only mandated testing still to be done is our hose testing which was scheduled for October but had to be postponed due to a Covid outbreak amongst the crew that was to come and do that testing. It will be done this spring with a date to be determined.

Department personnel continue to shovel hydrants to ensure that they are accessible if the need arises and to keep them visible for our mutual aid departments. We have approximately 140 hydrants throughout the North, South and Central districts.

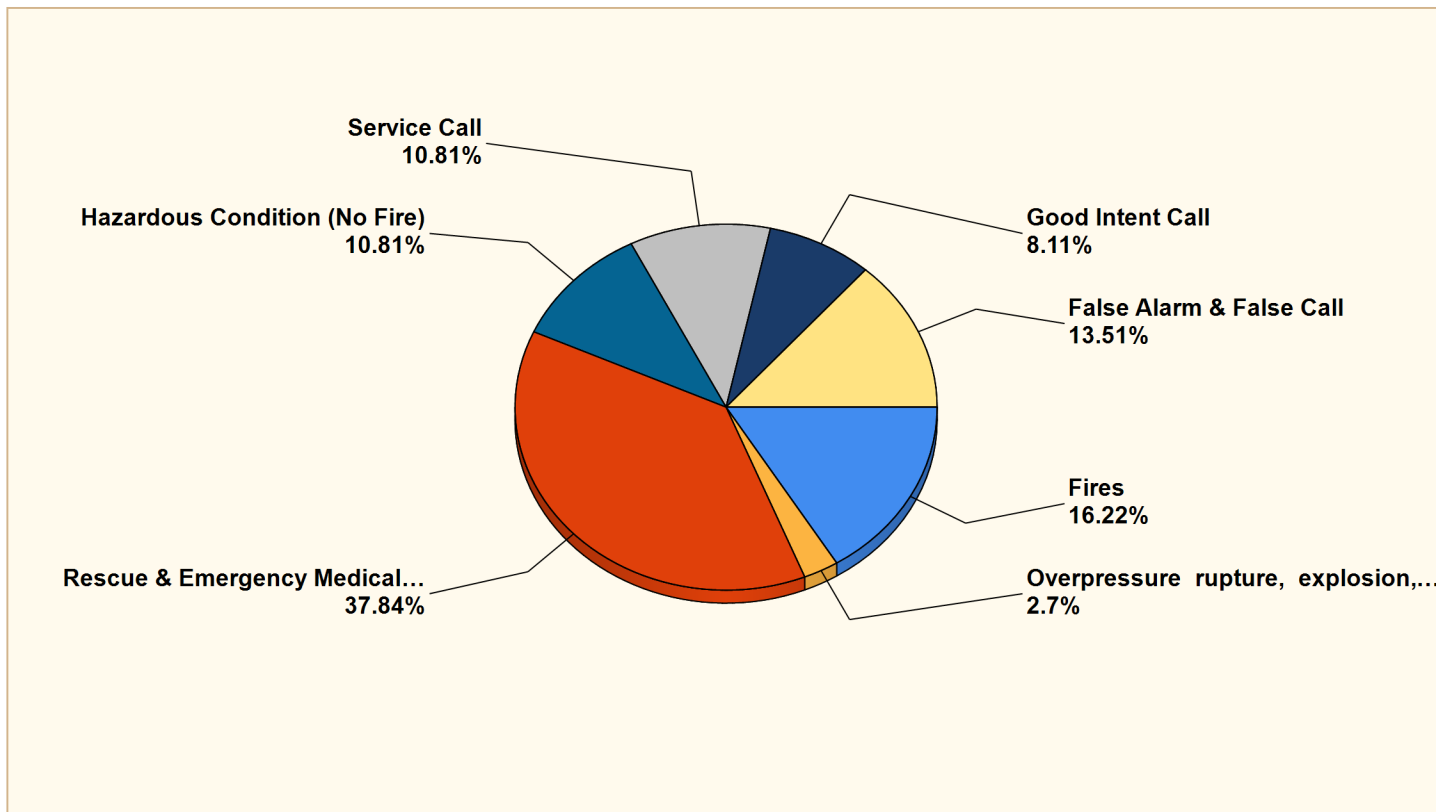
