Monthly Report for May 2022

Personnel: The department continues to train our newest firefighters to bring them up to speed. Two of our newest will complete the Maine Basic Fire School in approximately 2 weeks, which will qualify them as interior firefighters. We also had members attend an advanced extrication class in Fryeburg. Chief officers participated in an active shooter drill held at CMP's office here in Bridgton. This gave us a chance to meet and work with CMP staff and Cumberland County EMA staff to strengthen the lines of communication and improve our working relationships, if needed for any type of scenario.

Apparatus: The department continues work on specifications for the proposed mini pumper. Our goal is to be ready to move forward with the purchase in July, if approved by voters at the annual town meeting. Vehicle maintenance has completed the spring service on all apparatus and small equipment. One note of concern that arose during the spring service is the amount of rust on Engine One's frame. There is a spot near the rear axle that has corroded significantly. This will be monitored closely by our mechanic to assess the situation going forward.

Activities: The department provided staff to standby at Bridgton Academy's graduation, as is customary each year. Just as a reminder burn permits are available online at no cost at either www.burningpermit.com or www.maine.gov/burnpermit Burn permits are required when burning any type of yard debris, leaves, brush etc. Burn permits are NOT required for a simple campfire contained in a premade outdoor firepit or stone ring etc.

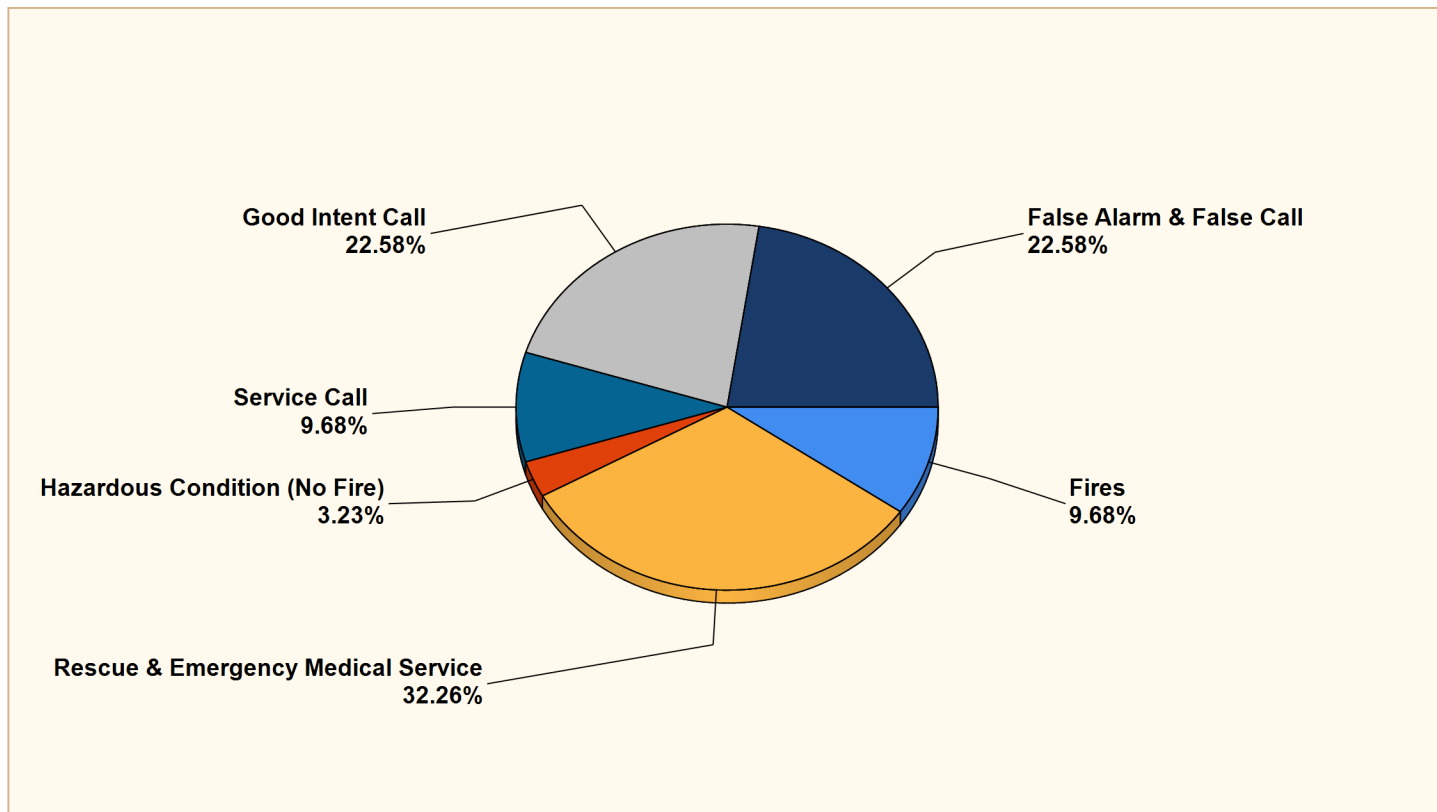
