Parks Crew & Wastewater

- Parks performed all weekly maintenance throughout the month
- Reminders and 30-day notices sent out; billed out quarterly sewer accounts
- The leach fields were mowed at Wayside
- Wastewater read and documented the pump station readings weekly; grounds maintenance was completed around pump stations as needed
- Mowed HAM fields and repainted the soccer lines
- Safety training provided to Public Works, Parks & T.S. employees. Done monthly.
- All monthly reports were done, including posting to the website pages
- Continued to follow up on septic tank pumping reminders
- Wastewater assisted Sargent with two sewer drains that needed to be cleaned out
- Parks crew spent some time with Lucia learning the flower gardens throughout town
- Winterized the bathrooms and snack shack at Harmon Field

Cemeteries ...

- Cemeteries crew continued their regular mowing and weekly maintenance throughout the month
- Grave openings still going on for a month or so longer
- Took care of a large tree that came down in the South High Street Cemetery, and repaired one monument that had damage from the downed tree.
- Continued removing leaves from all locations
- Painted fences at the cemeteries
- Winterized at Forest Hills

Transfer Station ...

- Have continued checking stickers. Many people have them in their glove box or dashboard as they do not want to adhere stickers to their vehicles.
- Continued with weekly auctions
- Constant can changes have slowed a bit for a total of 43 cans – 18 trash, 9 recycling, 8 demo and 8 metal
- Processed refrigerators; picked up and disposed of unprocessed units, moved out back
- Precious metals were picked up, as in copper wire and pipe
- Constant cleaning
- Store is still doing well
- We will be moving more leaves and moving ready compost soon
