



Bridgton Public Services Department Monthly Activity Report for August 2023



Parks Crew & Wastewater

- All monthly reports were done, including posting to the website pages
- Parks and Cemeteries performed weekly mowing schedule
- Wastewater recorded weekly meter readings
- Glen mowed the HAM Complex
- Reminders and 30-day notices sent out; billed out quarterly sewer accounts
- Glen worked at the HAM Complex
- Safety training provided to all staff – done monthly
- Glen installed a door in the garage

About Town ... Highway Road Crew

- Replaced culvert at 511 Kansas Road
- Glen helped highway with flagging for the paving crew
- Still ditching on Fosterville Road
- Put up road signs & patched roads
- Sweeping done on some sandy spots in town; hauled gravel
- Cut roads for culvert prep; laid 60 feet of culvert on Winterberry
- Fixed Willis Park washout and patched
- Cleaned up the back yard and got things in order
- Paved 16 tons on Hio Ridge and Kimball Road
- Graded Power House Road and added gravel
- Ditched Middle Ridge Road; paved in all of Bayberry
- Cut culverts for Swamp Road and Pleasant Street
- Paved in all cross pipes on Fosterville; fixed the sidewalk
- Put in driveway culvert on Winterberry and fixed washouts
- Put in a culvert at 11 Swamp Road
- Cleaned up around the shop and put away all of the painting supplies
- Finished ditching Middle Ridge
- Fixed Sabatis Island

Cemeteries ...

- Safety training provided to all staff – done monthly
- Parks and Cemeteries performed weekly mowing schedule
- Glen mowed the cemeteries on the outskirts of town

Transfer Station ...

- Weekly auctions
- The store is doing well, and has picked up
- Constant can changes have been increasing for a total of 54 cans – 24 trash, 13 recycling, 9 demo and 8 metal
- As always, constant picking up and cleaning around the facility
- Paint was picked up on 7/20/2023
- Salvation Army is still doing a great job with emptying the bins each week
- August Transfer Station charges were billed out
- Monthly report was posted to the website
- Safety training provided to all staff – done monthly
- Maine Scale had to come back this month and add a shim, then recalibrate the scale. They informed us that if we lose another load cell it could take a very long time to get it repaired. The reason being our scale is so old that they don't make parts for it anymore. We have asked for a quote for a new scale and/or upgrading what we have with a new system.
