January 2024 Monthly Report

Personnel: The department is in the process of conducting our mandatory training as required by the Bureau of Labor. We are using both an in person and online training format to allow members that aren't available the night the in person training is done to make that up at their convenience and remain in compliance with state standards. After the mandatories are done then the interior firefighters go through the process of medical clearance, SCBA facepiece fit testing, and finally a hands on SCBA refresher to remain proficient in using the airpacks. This is done every year by all interior firefighters.

Buildings: All stations have been trouble free so far this winter.

Apparatus: Progress is being made on the construction of our mini pumper ordered in Aug of 2022. Expected delivery time is in the spring of 2024. Also the bed enclosure for the Chief's vehicle arrived on 01/29 and has been installed by DPW. More wiring and outfitting needs to be done to make it complete and that will be done in the near future.

Activities: The department has busy with the previously mentioned trainings as well as shoveling hydrants. The run report for the month is attached detailing 38 runs for the month. One incident of note was a mutual aid call to Denmark on 01/27 to assist in rescuing 5 individuals whose UTV had gone through the ice on Moose Pond. All 5 persons were rescued and treated for hypothermia. A great job by all involved! The department is also preparing for the annual Winter Carnival and Freezin' 4 A Reason with the sponsors and stakeholders. The required annual flow testing on all of our airpacks was done by our vendor with no maintenance issues found. A great job by the department personnel throughout the year taking care of these important pieces of equipment.

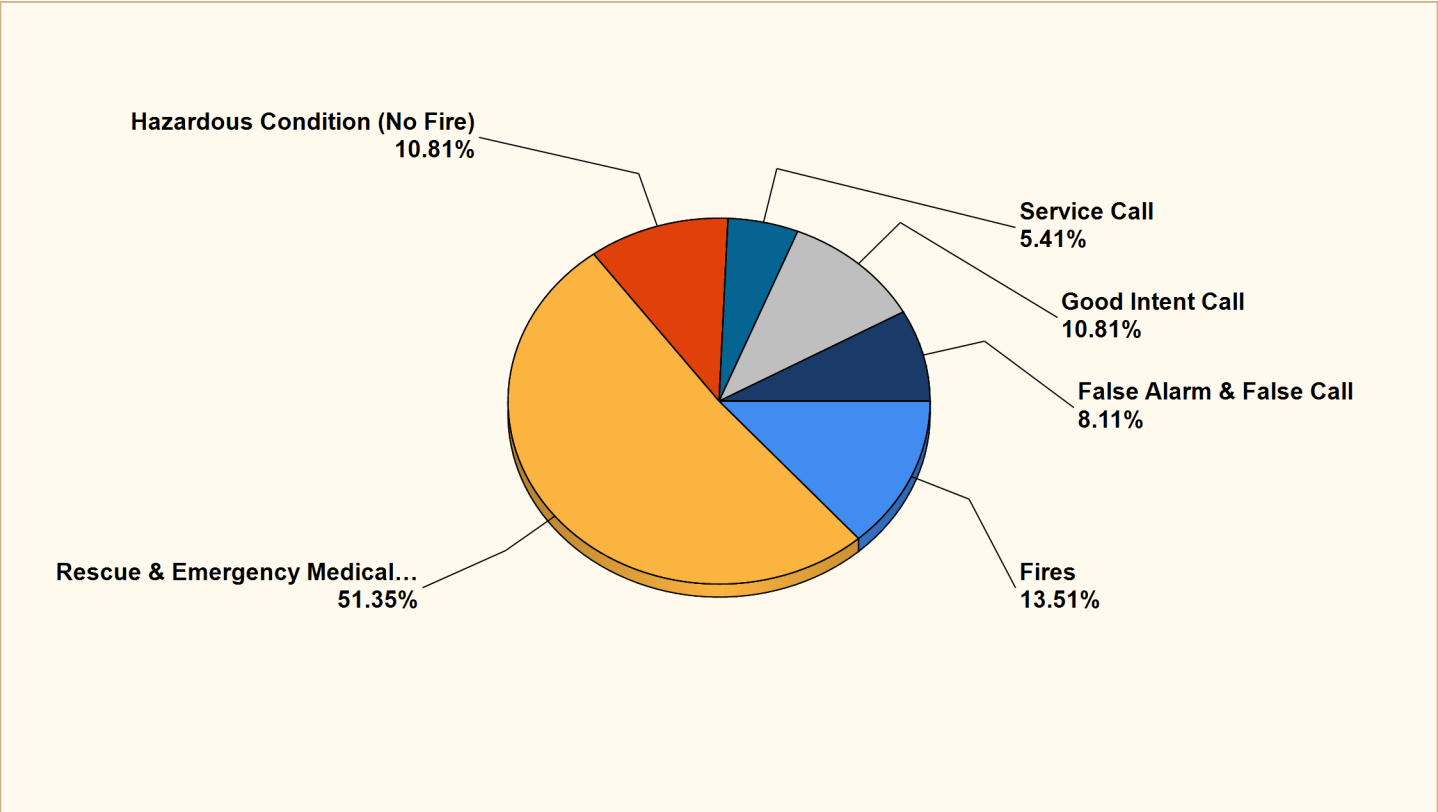
